Dear Welcome Bag Volunteers:

Thank you for assisting your association at FMCA's 108th International Convention.

You will be contacted directly by the Welcome Bag Captain, Doreen Sims. If you are on the grounds with the Advance Crew, the packing area set-up is on Friday, and the welcome bags are packed on Saturday, March 16, at 9:00 a.m. in Thurber Hall. If you have not been scheduled for a distribution shift, you may do so at this time. Greeter volunteers are assigned shifts for distribution only. Greeters will be given an March 17 Date of Entry.

Display the identification card and the date of entry credential you received with your confirmation materials.

Volunteers will be needed Saturday afternoon, March 16, in the Volunteer Parking areas, then at distribution locations in the Welcome Area at Pima County Fairgrounds on Sunday, Monday, and Tuesday, 17, 18, and 19. 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. On Wednesday, March 20, from 8:00 a.m. until noon. The welcome bags are given to each RV as they are staged to be parked.

Your Captains will have information later about which gates must be covered over the various days. Exact scheduling will be challenging until the arrival numbers and details are confirmed closer to the convention. Contact your Captain in advance if you have scheduling restrictions. Your Captains will distribute pins, hats, etc. when you have signed up for your shifts.

For distribution, bring a chair and water, dress for the weather conditions, and bring your happy smiles!

A volunteer appreciation will be at evening entertainment on Thursday, March 21, 2023. Please wear your hat or visor for evening entertainment.
